Applications are invited for a tenure-tracked position as Assistant Professor or Associate Professor in mathematics education. The expected starting date is August 2007.

To qualify applicants will have:

- Either a Ph.D. degree in mathematics with experience in working with K-12 education or a Ph.D. degree in mathematics education including at least the equivalent of a Master's degree in mathematics;
- Demonstrated potential for productive research in K-16 mathematics teaching and learning that is competitive for external funding; and
- Demonstrated interest and capability for teaching a wide range of undergraduate mathematics courses including courses for future K-12 teachers.

Preference will be given to candidates who have:

- Evaluated experience in teaching undergraduate mathematics including courses for future teachers;
- Evaluated experience in K-12 teaching or outreach;
- Evaluated research products in K-16 mathematics teaching and learning; and
- Evaluated experience in developing a program of research and teaching in mathematics education at a college or university.

In addition to effective teaching and productive research, responsibilities of the position include K-12 outreach activities, development of educational projects competitive for external funding, and collaboration with others in science and mathematics education in the University.

Women and minorities are especially encouraged to apply.

The selection process begins November 15, 2006; however, applications will continue to be accepted until the position is filled. Applicants should send a letter of interest, curriculum vitae, graduate transcripts, and statements of research plans and teaching philosophy to the address below. In addition, applicants should arrange for at least three letters of recommendation, with one or more letters addressing the applicant's teaching abilities, to be sent to:
